



The Western Foundation of Vertebrate Zoology, in Camarillo, California, has the world's largest collections of birds' nests, one of the largest collections of birds' eggs, and hundreds of mounted bird specimens. Come visit us to learn about bird biology, bird conservation, and birds of the world!

By prior appointment, we give tours to English and Spanish-speaking students in grades 4 and higher, including community college and university students, and to community and civic groups. Our hours of operation are Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Teachers and group organizers should call at least 3 months in advance to arrange dates and times. Our standard tour for all groups is approximately one hour, and we can host up to 40 people at one time (students, teachers, and parents included). For 4th-8th grade classes, we require at least 1 adult for every 15 students.

The fee for our tours is \$5 per person (students, teachers, and parents included). The WFVZ is a non-profit organization that uses the fees to maintain our collection materials for the use of bird researchers all over the world, and to offer education programs about birds and their conservation for our local community.
